SIM Work Group Updates

The **Community Linkages Work Group** met on February 17th. During the meeting, participants discussed the HIE infrastructure that would be necessary to support whole-person care through data sharing and integration. Participants emphasized the importance of having access to case management and social service (e.g. housing status, food security) information in the care profile, an electronic tool that aggregates available patient information.

In addition, DHCF informed participants of recent CMS opportunities that could be used to support the integration of health and social services, specifically through the <u>Innovation Accelerator Program for Housing Tenancy</u> and the Accountable Health Communities Model. DHCF Prepares to Interview Health Care Consumers

DHCF and Navigant Consulting, Inc. have been actively preparing to interview D.C. residents about their experience in the healthcare system. The information will be collected through one-on-one interviews and focus groups held at health care facilities throughout the District. The findings from the survey research will be used to inform D.C.'s State Innovation Health Plan (SHIP) under SIM.

CMS and Stakeholder Collaborative Announce Alignment and Simplification of Quality Measures

On February 16th, the **Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and America's Health Insurance Plans** <u>released</u> seven sets of clinical quality measures. The effort was part of a broad Core Quality Measures Collaborative, which includes a variety of health care system participants. These measures, which will be updated to include more measure sets over time, represent multi-payer alignment on core measures for physician quality programs. Through this alignment, the Collaborative is seeking to address the confusion that providers face when reporting multiple quality measures to different entities. CMS and the partner organizations believe that by reducing the complexity for providers and focusing quality improvement on key areas across payers, quality of care can be improved for patients more effectively and efficiently.
